- Broad aims of APTS:
 - equip students with clear 'mental map' of some important areas
 - help students gain confidence and resources (analytical and computing tools, literature entry-points) to find out more for themselves.
- ▶ (same) 8 modules each year
- each module has
 - ▶ preliminary work (~ 1 week)
 - ▶ 10 hours intensive work during 'APTS week'
 - follow-up 'assessment' materials (exercises/miniproject/essay, ~ 0.5 week)

11 September 2008, Second Advisory Committee for Member Institutions at University of Warwick

- open in principle to all PhD students (all years, all disciplines)
- **2007-2008:**
 - 121 applications from 29 institutions (22 of these being APTS member institutions)
- 60-63 accepted per week; 44 applied to attend all weeks.
 If APTS week oversubscribed, priorities:
- first-year stats/probability students
 - ► FPSRC-funded students
 - students from Member Institutions
 - students taking all 4 weeks
- ► Registration fee £56/£70 per APTS week in 2008-9
- ► EPSRC students subsidised (travel, accomm, subsistence)
- Member Institutions commit to a (fairly low) minimal level of participation; take part in the Advisory Committee; can use MI status in publicity etc. Register as Member Institution for 2008-2009 by 18 July 2008.
