#### 'MARX, ACCOUNTING, AND THE LABOUR THEORY OF VALUE'

Building on previous ECAS workshops, the conference will explore evidence of links between Marx's labour theory of value, accounting, and management, and consider the implications for the theory's continuing relevance in Marxist economics, critical accounting and management studies. It will examine the implications of the 'New Interpretation' for critical accounting, and applications and developments of the labour theory of value in other settings and for other issues. It seeks bases for fruitful collaboration between accountants, economists, strategists, and others in the management area, in both research and meaningful praxis.

The conference organisers envisage two tracks: (i) Marx, accounting and economics, (ii) Marx and critical strategy, but others are possible.
