



New e-journals for 2015

In May 2014 we ran a survey asking you what kind of library skills/information training you needed to make the most of HONNI. Access to journals was highlighted as a major area of concern. In response, we held a 'wishlist' exercise, and many of you suggested titles you would like to see available electronically via HONNI.

A subscription to an online journal usually costs thousands of pounds, so unfortunately it was not possible to buy all the titles you requested. However, we have done all we can to get maximum value for money from the budget and some of the newly available titles are shown below.

Many more titles are also accessible through a collection made available from Wiley. The collection includes over 400 leading titles in a wide range of disciplines - e.g. *Cancer, Journal of Advanced Nursing, Obesity* and *Journal of Clinical Pharmacy & Therapeutics*.

Improving the HONNI Discovery Service

Some recent improvements to the HONNI Catalogue and resource discovery service are highlighted to the right.

These are amongst a range of changes which have been made since the new system was implemented in September 2014, and efforts to improve the system further are ongoing.

By Summer 2015 we expect to introduce an enhanced version which will offer a more integrated service with additional features such as the ability to search within a particular journal from your search results. Keep watching the [HONNI Library Notices](#) for updates.

- ★ **New Search** link now connects to a customised, tabbed search screen instead of the HONNI home page. This ensures that, when starting a new search, you remain logged in to the Discovery Service and don't lose previous searches.
- ★ The 'Electronic Resources' category under Resource Types now accurately includes all electronic journals and books.
- ★ Rationalised results display helps ensure there are no entries in the holdings table for items which are not available.



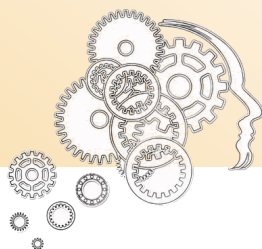
Enhanced ClinicalKey

ClinicalKey is a leading collection of medically focused online resources, including several hundred classic textbooks covering a range of disciplines. Sample titles are Campbell's Operative Orthopaedics, Goldman's Cecil Medicine, Gray's Anatomy, Guyton and Hall Textbook of Medical Physiology, Kumar and Clark's Clinical Medicine, Macleod's Clinical Examination and many more.

You can always be confident that you are consulting the most up-to-date edition of these textbooks, which are accessible to HONNI users from any internet-connected device including tablets and smartphones.

The collection also includes several hundred online journals, up to and including the current issue, such as Gait and Posture, Journal of Hand Surgery, The Knee, Manual Therapy, and Surgery. You can also access scores of drug monographs, international guidelines, and images for use in teaching sessions.

ClinicalKey was redesigned in 2014 to make it easier for you to find the evidence you need to underpin your patient care, and in 2015 the publisher is working with us to offer a series of update sessions around the HSC (see ClinicalKey Training article on the right).

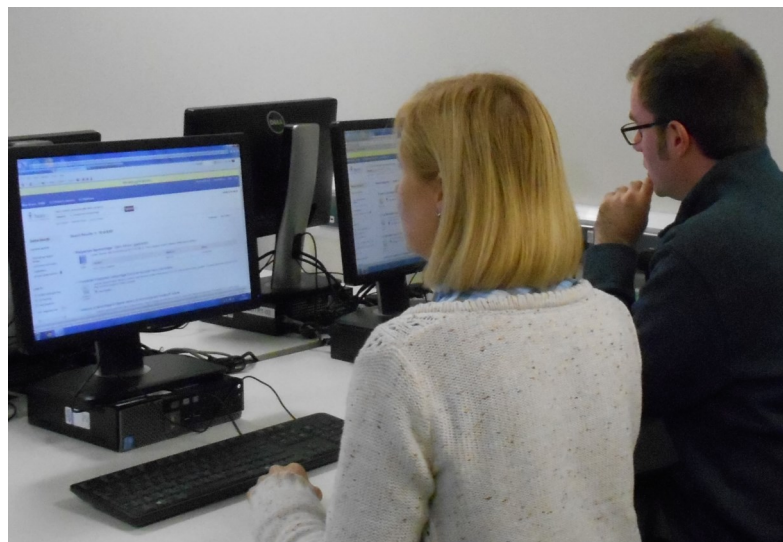


Refurbished Training Room open for business

Thanks to funding from the DHSSPSNI, we were able to refurbish the Training Room in the Medical Library at the Royal Victoria Hospital. As well as a state-of-the-art presenter's desk and a large format display screen, the room has eight PCs connected to the Queen's University Belfast network.

The facility has already been used to deliver courses to HSC staff from a range of disciplines, including Physiotherapists and newly registered Pharmacists, and more are planned.

The Renal Drug Database

Those of you who work with medication will be very familiar with the Renal Drugs Handbook, which was available in ebook form until 2014 when it was replaced with an online database. Following multiple requests, we are happy to report that the [database](#) is now available to all HONNI members.

For maximum functionality the database works best via the Mozilla or Chrome web browsers. There may be some issues with access via Internet Explorer depending on your setup.

We still carry copies of the print Renal Drugs Handbook but the ebook is no longer published.

The official launch of a new HONNI Hub at Newry's Daisy Hill Hospital took place on 5th March 2015 in the Postgraduate Centre, Clanrye House. The Hub provides Southern Trust staff with access to a wide range of online health and social care information through the [HONNI website](#).



HONNI enables HSC staff to use Queen's University Medical and HSC Library resources, free of charge. Any Southern Trust staff member can register to read ebooks, ejournals and databases, find information on any health and social care topic, request books or journal articles and get help and training to find the best evidence.

Welcoming the new resource, Southern Trust Medical Director Dr John Simpson said:
