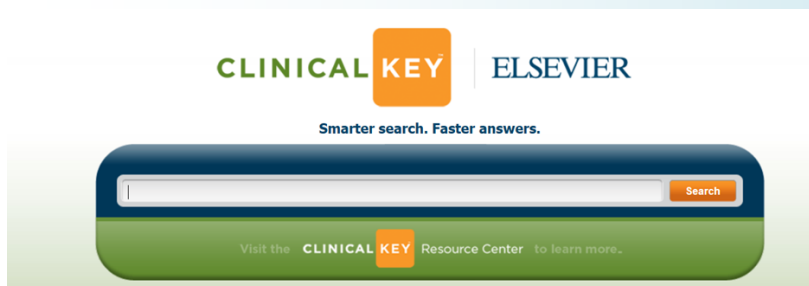
ClinicalKey will replace, and add to, the content of MD Consult, which is being discontinued by Elsevier.

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Article and Book Requesting is Changing

From 1st September 2013 the 50p currently charged for any articles sent to you will no longer apply. All articles and books from QUB and Medical and HSC libraries will be supplied free of charge (including postage).

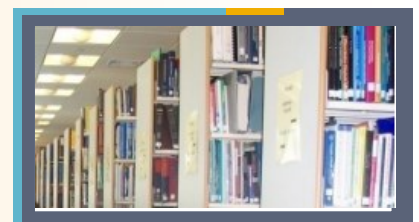
An £8 charge per item will be introduced for articles and books requested for you by the Medical and HSC Library network from the British Library or other external organisation. You can contact library staff or use the 'Other information' field on the honni [Place Request](#) Facility to tell us whether or not you want the item if it's only available outside the Medical and HSC Library network. Library staff will confirm the details with you before processing your request.

Existing vouchers will be valid up to the end of December 2013.

BNF app

The BNF app for mobile devices will shortly be available to honni users. The app allows you to access up to date prescribing information from the British National Formulary (BNF).

It enables users to browse and search full content from BNF, receive notifications when new editions and updates are available, bookmark content and choose preferred reading settings.

Once downloaded, the app can be run without an internet connection so professionals can access the BNF anywhere.

Your honni username and password will be required to activate the app and download the content. It is expected to be available during August 2013. Details will be published on the Library Notices area of honni as soon as the app becomes available so [watch this space!](#)

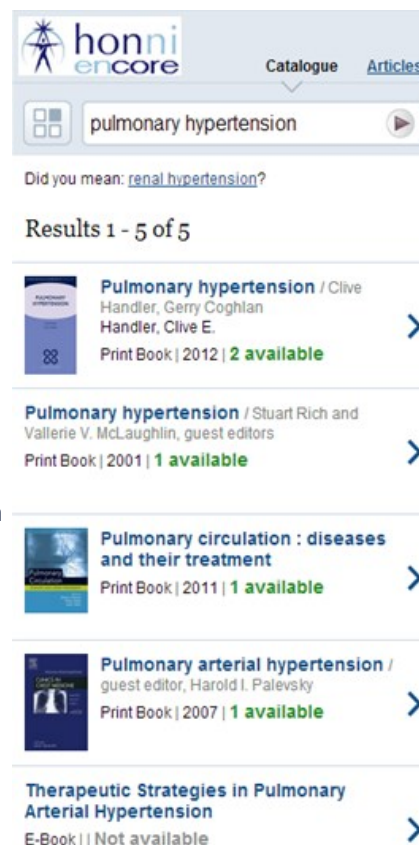
honni Encore mobile

If you are using a smart phone or other mobile device to access the library catalogue, you should use the mobile version of honni Encore. This is specifically designed to display site content in a more readable format for mobile devices.

To access the mobile site go directly to http://encore.qub.ac.uk/iii/mobile_hs. It works in exactly the same way as the full site except that, if you click on a honniconnect link, you will be asked to log in before you see what, if any, full text is available. This is a minor bug in the system which the software suppliers are working to resolve.

However, it does not adversely affect use of the site and, once logged in, you can continue to access resources in the normal way.

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honni hubs

PC workstations for access to honni are being installed in designated HSC sites across the province. Known as 'honni hubs' these will provide access to honni for any library member, particularly those who may not otherwise have easy access to a PC.

McClay Library Developments

Access to services on the ground floor of Queen's McClay Library will be affected by developments taking place over the summer.

The work is intended to increase the number of reader seats and PC spaces on the ground floor. Over 200 additional seats will be created on the ground floor, and the student lounge and toilet area will be increased in size.



Other planned service improvements include:

- Enhancement of wireless network performance
- Installation of an automatic book sorter to improve book circulation
- Routine replacement of PCs

Some library services will be affected, in particular:

- Book returns will be managed via the Borrower Services Desk while the book sorter is being installed; self-service book returns will not be possible during this period.
- Self-service book loans will be restricted to the upper floors for a brief period while the Borrower Services desk is re-configured to accommodate the book sorter. Borrower Services staff will facilitate loans where necessary.

While the work takes place over the summer months there will be some unavoidable noise, especially on the ground floor. Every effort will be made to ensure that large areas of the library will be undisturbed at any given period.

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
