Hidden populations : Hidden voices



- Significantly improves our understanding of new and emerging communities in Southwark and how we engage with them
- Informing service planning and resource allocation in relation to a range of key services including public health, housing, children's social care, electoral registration
- Raises questions about the accuracy of the 2011 Census figures for Southwark we believe that this could mean between 5,000 and 15,000 are hidden
- Evidence base for future discussions with DCLG about resourcing
- Research will be of use to other diverse inner-city areas and across a range of sectors
