Increasing amounts of public sector information are being made available to the public as a result of the UK government's open data initiative. It is hoped that wide availability of such open data will promote transparency of government, improve policy-making, and boost business innovation. This meeting will focus on statistics and data, considering what is available and what could be made available. Progress requires an effort on the part of producers - data needs to be in easily accessible formats and free of restriction on use and redistribution. At the same time, delivery of open data also raises some concerns and challenges, such as potential threat to privacy and the need for sound advice on the content and analysis of the data, not to mention resourcing and technology issues.

The speakers will discuss the benefits and risks of open data, from the points of view of both providers and users of such data.
