## Ljubljana

Ljubljana is the capital city of Slovenia, a small Central European country situated between the Alps and the Adriatic Sea, with a population of 2 million. The city lies at 298 metres above sea level and consists of the Baroque Old Town nestling at the foot of Castle Hill, Art Nouveau mansions and some of the masterpieces of the world renowned architect Jože Plečnik

## Currency

BLED - Visit to Lake Bled in the morning, renowned for its exceptional beauty with the forested slopes of the mountains as its natural background. Bled Castle, on a high rock above the lake, stands watch over the town and in the middle of the lake lies the island with the Church of the Assumption.
