



About your destination

Ljubljana

Ljubljana is the capital city of Slovenia, a small Central European country situated between the Alps and the Adriatic Sea, with a population of 2 million. The city lies at 298 metres above sea level and consists of the Baroque Old Town nestling at the foot of Castle Hill, Art Nouveau mansions and some of the masterpieces of the world renowned architect Jože Plečnik

Currency

The currency is called the Slovenian Tolar (SIT) and the current exchange rate is approximately US\$1= 239SIT. There is a link to up-to-date currency rates on the web page.

BLED - Visit to Lake Bled in the morning, renowned for its exceptional beauty with the forested slopes of the mountains as its natural background. Bled Castle, on a high rock above the lake, stands watch over the town and in the middle of the lake lies the island with the Church of the Assumption. There will be an opportunity to try the famous cake of town, Krenšnita.

POSTOJNA - In the afternoon travel to Postojna, where the caves consist of 20 km of sculpted galleries, chambers and halls. Visitors may take a train into the caves and admire their monumental beauty under the electric lighting, entrance included in price.
