- an abstract of no more than 300 words
- the full title

Presenters will be required to contribute one paper copy and one electronic copy of the full paper by September 28th. The presentation itself (including discussion/questions) will be allocated no more than 30 minutes. Presenters are required to pay the applicable conference attendance fee (details overleaf).
