Performance-Based Standards (PBS) is a key component for the future safety and innovation of heavy vehicles on the world's roads.

Recognising this, the International Forum for Road Transport Technology is organising an international seminar in Melbourne on 10-12 February 2003.

The seminar builds on the recent successful 7th International Symposium on Heavy Vehicle Weights and Dimensions in Delft, The Netherlands. It is being hosted by Australia's National Road Transport Commission and the Land Transport Safety Authority of New Zealand.
