Course Objectives

The course objectives are to enable you to:

- draw parallels between the racist behaviours based on eye colour in 'The Angry Eye' video with the racist behaviours based on skin colour (and with discriminatory treatment because of other 'isms') because of power inequalities in society;
- recognise the effects discriminatory treatment has on those who discriminate as well as those who are discriminated against;
- understand how discriminatory treatment can lead to negative behaviours which reinforce prejudice against people from less powerful groups;
- consider your own 'coping strategies' and the impact on yourself and your relationships;
- understand the terminology associated with equity issues and the power and importance of language;
- develop your assertiveness skills in challenging racism and all discriminatory treatment;
- understand and be better able to make the business case for eliminating discrimination and valuing diversity;
- build networks to support your personal development beyond the course.
