



How to Practise

Evidence Based Oncology

Following the success of the first 'How to practise evidence based oncology' course which was held in Antwerp in 2004, ESO is pleased to announce that a course will be held in 2005, this time at the Gustav-Streseman Institut in Bonn.

AIMS OF THE COURSE

'How to practise evidence-based oncology' will enable practitioners to determine which investigations work and which do not work in the management of malignant disorders.

Participants will learn how to:

- formulate answerable questions
- gather evidence and perform searches in electronic databases
- critically analyse, summarise and appraise the evidence
- apply the evidence in decision making at the bedside

FEATURES OF THE COURSE

A key feature of the course will be the small-group sessions during which participants carry out "hands-on" searches for evidence and evaluate the available evidence under the guidance of the course faculty. Each small group will present a brief report to the group and there will be plenty of opportunity for discussion and questions.

There will also be a number of presentations on the basics of evidence based oncology, such as bias, systematic reviews, meta-analyses, and the use of web-based tools.

The Gustav-Streseman Institut is equipped with wireless internet access. Participants are required to bring their laptop computer, including a W-LAN card (please visit www.gsi-bonn.de for details).
