The European Federation of Therapeutic Communities and the drug rehabilitation programmes of Slovenia are delighted to invite you to the 11th European Conference on Rehabilitation and Drug Policy in the lovely and historic city of Ljubljana. The conference is hosted by the therapeutic community, Drustvo "Projekt Clovek" (Project Man) and supported by the Ministry of Labour, Family, and Social Affairs of the Republic of Slovenia.

Join us in Ljubljana for one of the major events in the European drug treatment and policy calendar.

The over-arching theme for the Conference is that of working together with other carers, providers and commissioners to ensure a network of treatment services fit for the future which will meet the needs of the client. A network within which, the therapeutic community movement can play an effective and creative part.

Therapeutic Communities - Working with the Criminal Justice System

In Europe and around the world drug misuse has increasingly been seen as more a criminal justice than a public health problem. As a result the emphasis has moved to providing drug treatment as an alternative to imprisonment or actually within prisons. This theme will examine the work of therapeutic communities in the criminal justice system as they seek to deliver new and effective services to drug misusers. Possible topics: the impact of coercion on treatment; treatment outcomes; building partnerships in the criminal justice system; TCs inside prison.

Therapeutic Communities - Not Just Addictions

People present to drug treatment services with a range of problems in addition to their problems with drugs. Some may have physical disabilities or long-term illnesses such as HIV/AIDS or hepatitis. There is now a growing recognition that many will have mental health or personality disorder problems whilst others will have long-standing learning difficulties. This theme will examine some of the latest research and developments in the delivery of services to people with multiple difficulties. Possible topics: partnerships with mental and physical health services; treatment programme changes required for clients with multiple difficulties; research on drug users with multiple difficulties; evaluation of treatment programmes for clients with multiple difficulties.

Therapeutic Communities - Families and Communities

Therapeutic communities have included those actively involved with their local community and those staying separate from the community. Some communities have found creative and exciting ways to involve the families, local people and local organisations in their work. Others have built links and services to minority communities or make significant contributions to the social fabric of the wider community. This theme will present some of the best of these developments and explore ways of harnessing the energy of the therapeutic community to give and receive support to families and the wider community. Possible topics: the role of the family in the TC; building partnerships with local organisations; working with minority communities; the role of the TC in the wider community.

Therapeutic Communities - Contributors to Change

The world of drug treatment is changing beyond recognition. Increasingly, planners and policy makers are looking to establish integrated (though often still competitive) networks of services working in partnership to provide drug users with greater choice and a "seamless" treatment plan. What kind of partners will therapeutic communities be in this new and uncertain world? This theme will offer an opportunity to hear of exciting new developments and partnerships and to discuss the role of the therapeutic community in multi-agency networks. Possible topics: the changing social climate for TCs; the role of TCs in developing drug policy; evaluation and experience of treatment partnerships; outcomes, evaluation and evidence of effectiveness.
