4 July Teacher Inset, The Dig, York

This interactive and informative day is for teachers at Key Stage 2 to familiarise themselves with the Investigate! Archaeology pack and try some of the activities first hand. So if you want to find out more about Roman Catapults (levers and forces), Roman texting (co-ordinates) and many other STEM based archaeology activities, as well as visit The Dig, York's new hands on archaeology centre, this day is for you.

13 July The Learning Gap – Adult Learners & Archaeology, Yorkshire Museum As the Government refocuses education priorities, Universities have begun to cut adult learners courses with devastating effect in the archaeological sector. These courses have long inspired adult learners to enter the world of archaeology and also been a way for local community groups to develop expertise. This growing gap offers new opportunities to the MLA Sector. This discussion based day will show existing examples of good practice, look at how to develop programs for the "traditional" archaeological audience as well as new diverse audiences.

26 July Bone Idols!, University of Bradford

A specialist day looking at human bones aimed at curatorial staff and community archaeology groups. The day will begin with an overview of the "headless" Roman cemetery recently found in York (York Archaeological Trust) and then move on to anatomy. Learn how to determine the age and sex of a skeleton and discuss issues relating to the curation of human bones.

28 July Crime Scene Investigation, University of Bradford

This hands on archaeological day looks at various ways to engage children and young people through science and archaeology. Find out how to use your collection to develop a Crime Scene Investigation style activity. Catch up with current practice including interpreting human skeletons, grave yard surveys and how to use those bulk finds of pottery that lurk in the stores of many museums to inspire young people. You will be expected to take part!

19 August Help! The Romans are attacking Yorkshire, Crazy Catapults, Central Methodist Church Hall, York

Bring your club along to the Crazy Catapults Challenge. Work together as a team to make a crazy catapult. Compete against other clubs to see whose catapult is the most deadly and accurate. Meet a real Roman Soldier and find out what it was like to be in the Roman Army.
