# **INTRODUCTORY WORKSHOP**

### Workshop Objectives:

i) To initially familiarise all members and delegates with the previous activities of the AHRC / EPSRC 'Discovery in Design (DiD): People-centred Computational Issues' Cluster established under the 'Design for the  $21^{st}$  Century (D21C)' Initiative.

ii) To familiarise all members with the aims and objectives of the Institute and initial proposed activities as put forward in associated Network and D21C proposals.

A representative cross-section will be selected for short presentation on day one.

Day two will comprise break-out sessions relating to identified cross-disciplinary areas of interest and presentations from the groups followed by round-table discussion of the major identified issues. This will be followed by discussion relating to possible Institute activities over the next two years
