- this length but will be judged on first 1000 words. The document should be in Microsoft Word format, and sent by e-mail or by post on a CD. 4. Entries must be accompanied by at least one letter of support from a user, beneficiary, local authority (if the local authority is not the entrant) or
- consumer organisation. In the case of the IHT/Balfour Beatty Infrastructure Services Award for Effective Partnerships, all organisations involved in the partnership must provide a letter of support for the entry.

Eligibility

Entries will be accepted of examples entered by owners, clients or direct stakeholders, working in highways and transportation in a public, private or voluntary capacity. The example must have been introduced in practice since September 2005 or, for example, if it is a piece of research or new product, have demonstrable and practical application.

1. Entries which do not meet the criteria or which are not submitted in the requested format will not be considered.

- 2. Entries will be assessed by independent Judging Panels drawn from a range of IHT Technical Boards, transport consultancies, local government and other organisations.
- 3. The Judging Panel for each Award will score entries according to all of the criteria listed for each Award. Criteria marked with a * are allocated heavier weighting than other categories.
- 4. A shortlist of entries will be created by February 2007. Following this, the Judging Panel for each Award may request further information from short-listed entrants or choose to visit entries, as applicable
- 5. Winners of the IHT Awards 2007 will be announced at the IHT Awards Dinner 2007 on 7 June 2007 at the National Maritime Museum, London and details published in a subsequent issue of Transportation Professional.
