



What do we mean by "role"

"Roles" are social constructions where by the individual is defined by three sets of expectations.

- 1. Professional group to which the nurse belongs.
- People with whom the nurse interacts with (e.g. patients/clients/employees/doctors and other professionals).
- 3. The employer of the nurse.


What is a model?

 A model is simply a way for nurses to organise their thinking about nursing and then to transfer that thinking into practice with order and effectiveness Wright (1990) pp7. Chang's critique on selected models.

• Chang's critique on the first nine models (from 1980 – 1993) "they all provide a framework or conceptual model of OH nursing. But there are common weaknesses in that they lack clarity in the scope of OH nursing practice, lack a clear definition of the OH nurse role and lack empirical evidence". Factors influencing OH nursing practice(1994)
