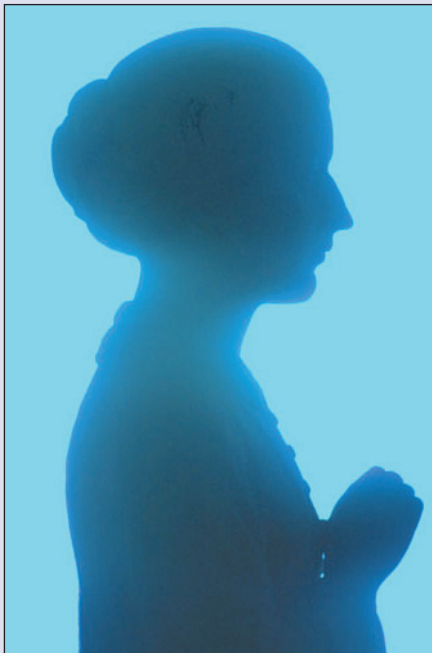


Professor Julia Faucett

Safe Work, Safe Care: a review of studies linking organisational factors with patient and nurse safety

Accumulating scientific evidence suggests that organisational decisions and actions play an important role in assuring safe patient care and also the health and safety of nursing staff providing the care. Operating from a theoretical perspective that

safe health care delivery settings address the well-being of both patients and staff members, Professor Faucett will provide an overview of research and consider current gaps in the literature and implications for practice.

Julia Faucett, RN, PhD, FAAN is Professor and Chair of the Department of Community Health Systems at the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF), and Faculty of the UC Center for Occupational and Environmental Health. Professor Faucett lectures on occupational injury prevention, the management of disability and pain in the workplace, and organisational assessment, and also on theory development for nursing research. Her programme of research investigates organisational, psychosocial, and biomechanical factors for their roles in safety and the prevention of work-related injury and disability.

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
