The Plastics SSN invites you to attend one of their FREE workshops co-ordinated by the Museum of Design in Plastics (formally the Design Collection Museum) – a specialist resource of the Arts Institute at Bournemouth – and funded by a Museums, Libraries and Archives Subject Specialist Network Implementation Grant.

The workshops will provide guidance on how to identify and care for plastics in your collection. There will also be an open discussion about plastics in relation to art, design and social history. There are four workshops being held at different venues around the UK, all covering the same subject area but with different guest speakers bringing their individual expertise to the collaborative plastics forum, thus enabling each workshop to approach plastics from a different perspective.

You are welcome to attend one or all of the informal workshops and there will be plenty of opportunity to ask questions and even bring along objects for discussion. The workshops are also a means of gathering information for an e-manual for the care and articulation of plastics which will be published on the web through Collections Link. Delegates will be encouraged to become involved in shaping its content and credited for their involvement.
