Since the development of community care, the responsibility for the assessment and management of mental health problems in different cultural groups has been spread among multiple professions. The Diploma and MSc in Transcultural Mental Healthcare has been developed in response to this. Students will develop a knowledge-base derived from the social anthropological, medical, sociological, epidemiological and pharmacological understandings of the presentation, expression and management of distress amongst black and ethnic minorities.

The Open Day is for students who wish to learn more about the Diploma in Transcultural Mental Healthcare. Prof Kam Bhui (Course director) and Dr Nasir Warfa (Course Co-ordinator) will be available to discuss the Diploma, MSc and answer questions.
