The position provides a unique opportunity to demonstrate academic leadership at the clinical interface in the area of nursing practice development.

The Professor will be a member of the UTS Faculty of Nursing, Midwifery and Health, but the primary operating base will be the Northern Network Hospitals (Prince of Wales, Sydney and Sydney Eye Hospitals) in South Eastern Sydney Illawarra Area Health Service.

The Professor will have an established research and practice development profile, with an academic background and clinician experience. She/he will play a leadership role in the development of exemplary nursing practice, initiating and consolidating research endeavours related to clinical practice, teaching in relevant courses, supervising higher degree students and working collaboratively with academic and clinical colleagues.

The Professor will be a person of vision with a high level of credibility within clinical areas in nursing. The successful applicant will have the ability to establish and lead research and practice development teams, both nursing and interdisciplinary, and have a proven ability to work with people from diverse backgrounds. The appointee will be expected to initiate and support linkages and interaction between Northern Network Hospitals (Prince of Wales, Sydney and Sydney Eye Hospitals) South Eastern Sydney Illawarra Area Health Service and the University of Technology, Sydney and the practice development research community of scholars in Australia and internationally.

Applicants for this position must be eligible for registration with the NSW Nurses and Midwives Board as a registered nurse and possess:

- A completed doctorate in nursing or related discipline or equivalent
- Extensive clinical experience in an appropriate field, with a record of innovative practice development research in nursing.
- Proven effective teaching and organisation skills in higher education.
- Strong nursing research profile with an exemplary publication track record
- Experience in the supervision of higher degree research students.
