On 4 June, the 19th anniversary of the 1989 Tiananmen Square crackdown on China's pro-democracy movement, Amnesty members and others will gather to show our support for people like the Tiananmen Mothers – a group of human rights defenders whose children and other close relatives were killed or injured in the crackdown.

We want human rights for China. We want international pressure on the Chinese authorities not to react violently against people standing up for human rights.
