The coaching programme at Goldsmiths is led by Steve Collins, Head of Staff Development and Coordinator of The CALM Network. Steve is also the programme leader of a pilot Level 5 Diploma in Management Coaching and Mentoring run in association with the Staff Development Forum which has helped a cohort of 19 Staff and Organisational Developers become active coaches in the higher education sector.

The goals of this one day conference are:

- 1. Review the Megginson and Clutterbuck¹ model of a coaching culture and its relevance to collegial leadership approaches in higher education.
- 2. Share the key features of the learning journey experienced by beginning coaches and tutors on the Diploma Programme
- 3. Discuss case studies on the organisational impact of coaching at Goldsmiths and other higher education institutions involved in the pilot.
