

## Courses in Drug & Alcohol Studies

Scottish Addiction Studies at the University of Stirling, Scotland has been offering on-line courses in the addictions since 1995. We have a strong reputation for academic excellence and innovation. In 2008/2009 Scottish Addiction Studies will be offering three validated courses:

University Certificate in Drug and Alcohol Studies - an undergraduate course for staff in the drug/alcohol misuse field and related professions. 44 Credits - Level 10 Scottish Credit and Qualification Framework (SCQF). The course comprises two modules, with Module 1 being the prerequisite for Module 2. Module 1: Policy and Practice (DAS901) & Module 2: Understanding & Evaluating Addiction Treatment (DAS903). May be studied part-time over one or two years. CLOSING DATE - 15th AUGUST 2007.

Drugs, Alcohol and Nursing - an undergraduate course for nurses and midwives. 22 Credits - Level 9 (SCQF) for Module 1 plus 22 Level 10 credits for Module 2. Module 1 is a prerequisite for Module 2. Module 1: Society and Health (NUR179) and Module 2: Understanding & Evaluating Addiction Treatment (DAS903) may be studied part-time over one or two years. Module 1 is available from either September 2008 or February 2009. Module 2 is available in the Spring Semester (in February each year). Module 1 is available as a "stand-alone" module. CLOSING DATE - 12th SEPTEMBER 2008.

Doctor of Applied Social Research (Drug & Alcohol Studies) - The award of Doctor of Applied Social Research, is equivalent to a PhD. Doctoral students will need to demonstrate scholarship, methodological expertise, a contribution to knowledge about practice and a contribution to practice. Directed study for the Professional Doctorate is on a part-time basis over four years. The programme includes seven core modules (taught on campus), three professional modules (taught on-line) and a thesis. The professional modules are on-line and are available separately as a Postgraduate Certificate. (Please note that only the propfessional modules are currently available on-line). CLOSING DATE - 15th AUGUST 2008.
