- ◆ Our MSc programme is delivered on Campus, by Distance Learning and/or Blended methods through the use of e-learning technology to develop a cooperative virtual learning classroom. Both On-campus and virtual learning classrooms (VLC) involve lectures, problem based learning (PBL) opportunities, critical reviews and group discussions.

- ◆ The Diploma/MSc MH & Transcultural Mental Healthcare has been developed in response to the need to improve cultural competency within mental health care services. Students will develop a knowledge-base derived from the social anthropological, medical, sociological, epidemiological and pharmacological understandings of the presentation, expression and management of distress amongst black and ethnic minorities.
- ◆ Teaching encompasses a number of different methods and strategies. Problem Based Learning (PBL) is one example which is used in the early stages of the course. Lectures and PBL Classes are run on Wednesdays.
