Candidates specializing in Applied Linguistics (SLA studies, language pedagogy, computer-assisted language learning, sociolinguistics, discourse analysis, pragmatics, intercultural communication, and related areas) are encouraged to apply. In addition to teaching and research, the candidate will also be expected to train and supervise graduate student apprentices. The candidate will also be a key participant in current efforts to transform a program with an outstanding tradition in teaching into a department with an innovative research agenda. The language competency may be in any of the following: Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Hebrew, Hindi/Urdu, Italian, Portuguese, or Russian. The position carries a five-course equivalency workload, which normally means teaching four courses over three quarters and carrying out significant academic and service responsibilities. The campus is especially interested in candidates who can contribute to the diversity and excellence of the academic community through outstanding research, effective teaching and committed service.

The Language Program is in the <u>Division of Humanities</u>, which also includes the Department of American Studies, Feminist Studies, History, History of Consciousness, Linguistics, Literature, Philosophy, and the Writing Program. The Division has a strong tradition of collaborative and interdisciplinary work and we especially encourage applications from strongly qualified candidates eager to extend their teaching and research activities across departmental and disciplinary boundaries.

RANK: One position at Assistant (tenure-track), Associate or Full Professor (tenured)

<u>Assistant Professor level</u>: Applicants must have a Ph.D. or foreign equivalent in a relevant field at the time of application. The successful candidate must present demonstrated evidence of major research activity and university teaching experience.

Associate or Full Professor level: Applicants must have a Ph.D. or foreign equivalent in a relevant field. The successful candidate must present evidence of a strong research and publication record; at least ten years of teaching experience at the university level, including teaching beginning, intermediate and advanced language courses; curriculum development; a record of successful administrative experience in a Language Program or Department, including personnel assessment and budgetary matters.

All candidates are expected to evince native or near-native fluency in their language(s) of specialization.
