

ART HISTORY – The Department of Art History and Communication Studies at McGill University invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track position in Art History with specialization in Early Modern (before 1600)/Renaissance or Medieval art and visual culture, beginning in August 2009. Although the appointment is expected to be made at the Assistant Professor level, applications from more advanced candidates are also invited. The specialization is open to all geographical locations and media. The successful candidate will be asked to teach and advise at the undergraduate and graduate (MA and PhD) levels, and to conduct scholarly research. Participation in committee work and other aspects of University life is also required. Candidates should hold a completed PhD and have teaching experience. Knowledge of French is an asset. Applications should include statements of research and teaching, writing samples, course syllabi and evaluations, curriculum vitae and two confidential letters of recommendation.
