Programme & Cost

The conference will open with registration on the afternoon of Wednesday 22 April 2009. There will be a keynote address on Thursday 23 April, followed by parallel workshop sessions. Friday 24 April will start with another series of parallel sessions, and will conclude with a plenary session. A conference dinner will take place on the evening of Thursday 23 April 2009.

The conference registration fee includes a printed book of abstracts and an electronic copy of the conference proceedings, refreshments and lunches during the conference, the reception and the conference dinner. The conference costs £395 (or £350 if booked before 15 March 2009), with a discounted rate of £200 for students.

There will be a PhD workshop on the afternoon of Wednesday 22 April 2009, with a limited number of places available at £50 each.
