

KeyCSM Launch Event

Innovative Software for the Creation of Conceptual Site Models

Date and venue

The KeyCSM launch will be held on **4th November 2008** at the University of Nottingham's Ebdon Laboratory, within the Clive Granger Building, **Nottingham**. This one-day event will run from approximately 10am to 4pm. Full joining instructions will be emailed to each delegate (Principal User – see order form) prior to the event.

Why KeyCSM is needed?

A conceptual site model (CSM) summarises the 'state-of-the-art' understanding of sources, pathways, and receptors at potentially contaminated sites.

Despite the paramount importance of the CSM for planning further site investigations and for informing risk assessment decisions, numerous challenges are faced when developing and reviewing CSMs. One such challenge is the lack of a consistent method for storing and presenting site-related information in the form of a CSM which can be easily interpreted and updated as the CSM evolves.

Land Quality Management Ltd (LQM) worked with Keynetix Ltd to develop the KeyCSM software to store, manipulate, and present site-related information for the purpose of creating clear and informative CSMs.

Amongst its many capabilities, KeyCSM can be used to create detailed plans, cross sections, network diagrams and matrix diagrams to represent the sources, pathways and receptors associated with a potentially contaminated site.

LQM/CIEH GAC Publication

In July 2006 LQM and CIEH facilitated a unique workshop at the University of Nottingham which resulted in the development of generic assessment criteria (GAC) compliant with UK policy and guidance for use in generic quantitative human health risk assessment.

The workshop brought together a number of practitioners from both the public and private sector who sourced contaminant specific toxicological and physico-chemical input data for use in the derivation of the GAC using the CLEA-UK (beta) risk assessment tool.

The delegates were guided in their preparation and during the workshop by LQM staff, who have also subjected the workshop outputs to rigorous review and prepared them for publication.

The joint LQM and CIEH GAC values for over 30 substances together with the underlying basis for their derivation including the fate and transport and toxicity input values are contained within this publication. It is hoped that this publication will assist the wider contaminated land community in fulfilling their roles and responsibilities in their day-to-day work in the management of land contamination.

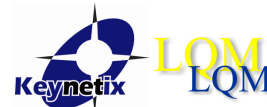
