Job description

Research, teaching and supervision of Master's students and doctoral students. The successful applicant will be expected to conduct research and to contribute actively in seeking external research funding for both his/her own research and for research groups. Further, the successful applicant will be expected to participate in course-development, teaching and examination, first and foremost at the advanced and doctoral programme levels. The work associated with the position is divided 50-50 between research and other departmental duties (including teaching etc.).

Qualification requirements

In order to be eligible for the position as Professor of Criminology, the applicant must be able to demonstrate a high level of scientific proficiency within the subject area of criminology, or in a closely related discipline, and must have a well-documented record of teaching proficiency. The applicant must be able to teach in either English or Swedish.

Bases of assessment

When assessing an applicant's suitability for the appointment, *special emphasis* will be placed on the following

- Scientific proficiency that has been demonstrated in the form of different types of publication and that is of the standard required by the international research community.
- Teaching skills and the capacity to inform and communicate about research.

Some emphasis will be placed on the following

- The capacity to generate research funding.
- A documented capacity to work with the management of research projects and other tasks, and administrative proficiency.
- The capacity to work collaboratively in relation to the wider community, at both the national and international levels.

The applicant is not required to speak Swedish at the time of the appointment, but the successful applicant will be expected when needed, and within a couple of years, to be able to undertake administrative tasks and teaching work that will require an understanding of Swedish.

Since the Faculty of Social Sciences is actively working to achieve a more equitable gender distribution among its professors, the University particularly welcomes applications for the position from women.

Guidelines for the application are given in the *Template for application for employment and for promotion to the rank of professor or senior lecturer at Stockholm University*. The template can be downloaded from www.su.se/nyanstallning or be provided by the administrative coordinator. There you can also find *Rules of Employment for the Hiring of Teachers* and other relevant documents.

It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that the application follows the template and that it is submitted in due time.
