Which data are sensitive? Should definitions be changed and new restrictions on access implemented?

This highly topical seminar organised by the Centre for Longitudinal Studies (CLS) will explore public and professional perceptions of sensitive data and consider the implications for legislators and conducting surveys and analysing their data. It will also provide a unique opportunity to hear the views of respondents concerning their involvement in long-term research which includes the collection of sensitive data.
