

Full time, three year PhD studentship. Neurodevelopmental Disorders and Behavioural Phenotypes.

A full time, three year PhD studentship is available from October 2009 in the area of neurodevelopmental disorder and behavioural phenotypes. The studentship is available for the study of cognitive, emotional and behavioural difference and disorder in children and young adults with rare genetic syndromes. The new PhD Postgraduate will join a team of five research fellows, six PhD Postgraduates and six Clinical Psychology Doctoral Postgraduates at the University of Birmingham who are studying neurodevelopmental disorders and gene-environment interactions in people with intellectual disability (see www.bham.cndd.ac.uk).

The successful candidates will have a First or high Upper Second Class Honours degree in psychology, a clean driving licence and unbounded enthusiasm for research and the promotion of the wellbeing of people with severe disability.

The studentships will be at the basic UK research council rate (expected $\pounds 12,000$ p.a. in 2009/10) to provide support over the three-year period and will cover tuition fees. The successful candidates might also be eligible to contribute to our paid Teaching Assistant programme.
