From Foragers to Farmers is a peer-reviewed collection of papers honouring the career of Prof. Gordon C. Hillman and celebrating his considerable contribution to archaeology, especially in the field of archaeobotany; it is a secret festschrift, please do not mention it to him! Gordon Hillman is a pivotal figure in world archaeobotany, developing key ethnographic-based models that underpin analysis of Old World assemblages and being at the forefront of methodological developments from the 1970s until the present day. He also taught, supervised and inspired several generations of archaeobotanists who have transformed the sub-discipline from a minor and marginal concern to one of the pillars of contemporary archaeological practice. Though he retired in 1997 Gordon's influence continues, as demonstrated in the volume, which provides ongoing discussion of Gordon's ideas, as well as new insights into ancient foraging and farming.

Produced following his recognition through the Distinguished Economic Botanist Award in 2004 by the Society for Economic Botany, the volume includes 28 original theoretical, biographical and analytical papers forming a major body of scholarly work. Studies in the volume draw on archaeological, experimental and ethnographic perspectives to investigate many of Gordon's key interests including the origins of agriculture, ancient farming systems, use of wild food resources and the development of ancient economies from the Palaeolithic to Medieval periods. They also demonstrate the reach of Gordon's influence, including papers from Europe, several regions of Asia, Africa and America, with personal reflections by long-standing friends and colleagues. Several papers present new primary archaeobotanical and experimental data with important theoretical contributions concerning the study of agricultural origins, complex economies and seasonality.
