The International year of Biodiversity is planned to align with the next conference of the Convention on Biological Diversity in Nagoya, Japan in October 2010 will assess international progress towards this target.

Goals of the International Year of Biodiversity 2010

Through the International Year of Biodiversity 2010 we hope to reflect the goals of organizations working all over the world to safeguard biodiversity. As such, the objectives of the International Year of Biodiversity 2010 are as follows:

- Enhance public awareness of the importance of safeguarding biodiversity and of the underlying threats to biodiversity.
- Raise awareness of the accomplishments to save biodiversity that have already been realized by communities and governments.
- Encourage individuals, organizations and governments to take the immediate steps needed to halt the loss of biodiversity.
- Promote innovative solutions to reduce the threats to biodiversity.
- Start dialogue between stakeholders for the steps to be taken in the post-2010 period.

As part of the International Year of Biodiversity, the Convention of Biological Diversity (CBD) based in Montreal Canada, has called for countries around the world to raise the profile of the year by encouraging diverse organisations to engage with the issues and celebrate the importance of biological resources.

As was noted in the Westminster House of Commons report on biodiversity, issues and responses cut cross all aspects of human activity – hence the aim for wide engagement. IYB-UK <u>www.iyb-uk.net</u> has been formed as a part of the response. IYB-UK is an informal partnership of many organisations from diverse sectors who share a common concern to conserve our biodiversity, and who wish to raise awareness and encourage active participation around the issues that affect biodiversity loss. The secretariat is hosted by the Natural History Museum in London, and supported in England by the Department of Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra), the department responsible for

biodiversity, and by the Museum's sponsoring department the Department for Culture Media and Sport (DCMS).

The <u>www.iyb-uk.net</u> peer-to-peer website was launched on biodiversity day 22 May 2009 and since then the number of participant organisations has grown in number, diversity and regional representation. The partnership will support the global campaign, using its identity and working under its slogan **Biodiversity is Life**, while adapting the messaging to meet UK audiences. The **UK Biodiversity of Life Partnership** (IYB-UK) will be launched publicly on 25 November 2009 at a event at the Natural History Museum.

IYB-UK is coordinated via a small secretariat based at the Natural History Museum, which will support the informal, wide cross-sector partnership of organisations aiming to engage in the International Year of Biodiversity 2010 in the United Kingdom and its territories. The secretariat is supported in England by the government department responsible for biodiversity – the Department of Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) and by the Museum's sponsoring department the Department for Culture Media and Sport (DCMS).

Among the events planned for the year will be:

- Inter-academy Panel Meeting on biodiversity hosted by the Royal Society in January
- Major partner event programme for 22 May international Biodiversity Day
- Programmes across broadcast, published and interactive media
- Education resources developed for UK schools
- Major international exhibitions on Deep Ocean biodiversity; Imaging Biodiversity; and others
- A UK wide programme of events and activities in libraries, museums, colleges and arts organisations
- Launch within the Darwin Centre at the Natural History Museum, of the Angela Marmont Centre for UK Biodiversity
