Challenging Higher Education: Newer researchers' perspectives

Now in its sixth year, we are pleased to invite you to participate in the SRHE Postgraduate and Newer Researchers' (PGNR) Annual Conference. This one-day conference precedes the SRHE annual conference and will be held at the famous Celtic Manor, close to Newport in South Wales and venue for the prestigious Ryder Cup in 2010. The PGNR Conference is the main annual event of the SRHE Newer Researchers' Network.

We aim in this conference to provide a supportive, capacity-building event for newer researchers in higher education. As well as the opportunity to present your work in a range of formats, we provide opportunities for chairing papers, involvement in the panel discussions, and a range of networking events. This event is open to a broad community, including those in the early stages of a research career in HE, those currently studying in the field and those who may have more experience but are new to the issues in HE research and want to find out more.

This Conference will be chaired by Dr Arwen Raddon from the University of Leicester (UK) with cochairs Mr Romulo Pinheiro from the University of Oslo (Norway) and Mr Patrick Baughan from City University London (UK). Dr Raddon is the Convenor of the SRHE Newer Researchers Network and a member of the SRHE Research and Development Committee. Romulo Pinheiro and Patrick Baughan are Co-convenors of the Network.

Conference Theme and Call for Papers

The theme of this year's conference again draws from that of the annual SRHE Conference, which is held directly following this event. However, we also seek to bring additional areas of discussion, debate and reflection to this theme within the context of postgraduate and newer researchers' experience.

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This year's theme - **Challenging Higher Education: Newer researchers' perspectives** - raises interesting debates and issues for examination. We can read the theme of 'challenging' in a number of ways, including the challenges faced in higher education but also the ways in which we are seeking to challenge the higher education environment through our practice, research and participation. We invite you to submit proposals under the following streams:

Theme 1 Facing challenges in higher education

Papers which explore responding to and dealing with current challenges in higher education: knowledge, policy and practice

Relevant issues might include (but are not confined to):

- Forging careers in HE, recruitment and retention
- Changing demands on HE staff and institutions
- Innovations in teaching, research and HE management
- Widening participation and the changing student population
- Economic downturn, financing and the future of HE
- Adapting to meet national and international policy demands (e.g. Lisbon 2010)

Theme 2 Challenging higher education

Papers which review, question or challenge higher education: knowledge, policy and practice

Relevant issues might include:

- Alternative ways of thinking about the role of higher education in society
- Historical and comparative developments in HE practice
- Critical, postmodern and postcolonial approaches to research and teaching in HE
- Pedagogy and praxis
- Competing disciplinary knowledge bases in HE.

Proposals for analytical, reflexive or literature review-based presentations within these two streams are welcomed. Submissions will be peer-reviewed. Proposals which do not fall under the specific themes will be considered. However, please ensure that it is clear how they relate to the conference theme.

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Submissions Process

The deadline for submission of proposals is 17 August 2009

Please submit an abstract of up to 450 words to the conference team using the online submission system. All proposals must be submitted electronically, via the SRHE website at http://www.srhe.ac.uk/conference2009/ Authors will find here all the instructions needed on what is required in making a submission.
