- A range of workshops exploring issues relating to research with BME communities
- Opportunities for networking in relation to specific topics or interests of participants



An initial seminar was held in February 2009 attended by over 60 people involved in research, policy and practice. This seminar was organised by a mental health and ethnicity special interest group, which has recently been formed in Scotland, aiming to create links between individuals with an interest in mental health and ethnicity research in Scotland and share knowledge, research and evidence in this field. This initiative is led by NHS Health Scotland, in partnership with the Mental Health Foundation and a range of other organisations with an interest in mental health and ethnicity research.
