Nightingale School of Nursing and Midwifery at Kings College London and a Visiting Academic with the National Perinatal Epidemiology Unit at the University of Oxford. Her research interests include developing systems to improve continuity of care for women, monitoring quality and safety of maternity care, maternal morbidity and mortality, birth unit design and developing competency standards for maternity care services. She is currently supervising a number of PhD, Masters and Honours students who are studying aspects of improving maternity services including CenteringPregnancy, quality and safety in maternity care, workforce issues for midwives and obesity in pregnancy. She also co-leads a new consortium called BACI - Birth After Caesarean Interventions which is interested in research to promote normal birth and increase the rate of vaginal birth after caesarean section.
