PAPERS

Abstracts for papers should be relevant to the conference themes. Papers will be allocated 20 minutes followed by about 10 minutes for discussion.

SYMPOSIA

A symposium should consist of three or four papers with a shared focus. Each symposium will be allocated 90 minutes, to include discussion and debate. Authors wishing to submit papers as a symposium must complete a SINGLE abstract form, giving a brief outline of each of the presentations and how they link together. One person should be nominated as the main correspondent for the abstract submission. The abstract must include an outline of the proposed symposium and itemise the individual papers and their authors.

WORKSHOPS

Abstracts should provide a clear statement of what participants can expect to gain by attending the workshop. Workshops will be allocated 90 minutes and should actively involve the audience through discussion and experiential activities.

STUDENT BURSARIES

The WDHE 2010 conference committee encourages abstracts from postgraduate students. The conference aims to provide an opportunity for students to share their ideas in a supportive and inclusive environment, and a limited number of bursaries are available. - an understanding of current debates and research.

- Abstracts for papers must be no more than 400 words.
- Abstracts for symposia must be no more than 450 words.
- Abstracts for workshops must be no more than 400 words.
- Please indicate whether you are submitting a paper, symposium or workshop.
- Please indicate with your submission if you would like it to be considered for a bursary.
- Abstracts must be written in English.
- Please include the names, job titles and institutions of all authors, with full address and contact details of the main correspondent.
- Include full references, as appropriate.
- Abstracts must be submitted by Monday, 15th February 2010.
- You will be notified that we have received your abstract by return; please contact the Conference Office if you do not hear from us.
- All authors will be told if their abstract has been accepted in mid March 2010.
