The internationally-renowned Wilberforce Institute for the study of Slavery and Emancipation (WISE) is one of the few research centres in the world that offers expertise on both historical and contemporary slavery. Our Masters programme offers you the opportunity to study slavery and emancipation in historical contexts and to explore the conditions under which modern slavery and human trafficking continues today.

The MA can be studied full-time in one year or part-time over two. There are two core modules - one on historical slavery, the other on modern slavery and specialist training modules in either historical or social sciences research. You can also select from a number of optional modules chosen from a range of disciplines. The final component is a Dissertation.

We expect to offer a limited number of scholarships which cover full fees at the Home/EU rate as well as other bursaries.
