# Language, Migration and Identity

**Language, Migration and Identity** is the theme of our thirtythird national conference being held at the University of Surrey, Guildford.

We are pleased to announce that **Professor Celia Roberts** has accepted our invitation to give the keynote address. Celia is Professor of Applied Linguistics at King's College London in the Department of Education and Professional Studies. She has been working in the field of language, culture and discourse for thirty years.

Her talk is entitled *Language, Migration and the Gatekeepers*. 'Global flows of people seeking work or asylum face a series of institutional gatekeeping processes. Their perceived competence and trustworthiness depends upon the extent to which they can fit their stories and versions of themselves into the institutional categories of the state or the workplace. This talk will give some case studies of various gatekeeping processes around the world and then will focus on the 'linguistic penalty' that migrants face in job selection interviews and professional licensing exams. Implications for ESOL teaching and learning will be discussed'.

The conference offers a choice of **workshops** covering a wide range of practical and theoretical themes for both new and experienced teachers, teacher trainers, researchers and managers. There are good opportunities for **networking**, catching up with the latest developments and optional participation in **Voice of Conference debates**. On Saturday afternoon you can attend a **performance** by *Actors for Human Rights*, the outreach arm of IceandFire. The group performs documentary scripts, exploring human rights stories through performance and has been invited back after a very successful appearance at our 2008 conference. Trinity College London sponsors this free performance.

The popular **resources exhibition** is centrally located in the lecture theatre building. There will be publishers and awarding bodies present with representatives on hand to answer your queries and questions. It's a great time to browse resources and really see what you're getting before you buy it.

**Guildford** is the picturesque and historic county town of Surrey. There is plenty to do and see. The town centre and the cathedral are a short distance from the Stag Hill campus, which you will find is compact and well signposted. The **accommodation**, exhibition area, workshop rooms and the restaurant are within easy reach of each other. The **location** is easily accessible with very good road links and ample free



parking for delegates. From the railway station there is a frequent bus service that goes the short distance onto the campus itself. Guildford is 35 minutes by train from London Waterloo; there are direct trains from Portsmouth and train links from Gatwick and Reading.

Attending conference is a great way to build up the hours needed to meet your **Continuing Professional Development** requirement – you will receive a certificate of attendance. NATECLA members benefit from a **reduced conference fee** and there will be a discount for booking before 14 May 2010. Personal members who are unable to get their place funded by their organisation may apply for a bursary – these are subject to availability and members need to check the criteria. Closing date for application is 14 May.
