Calling all geographers (and sociologists, anthropologists, urban studies scholars, architects and anyone else) interested in tourism spaces!

In this seminar, hosted in the Costa Daurada region of Catalonia's Mediterranean coast, we aim to examine and contrast origins, different perspectives on and approaches to the geography of tourism from across European regions and language traditions. Authors such as Coles (2004), Gibson (2008) and Page and Hall (2009) have noted the general dominance of Anglo-Saxon voices in research on tourism geographies – not just in linguistic terms – but also in relation to the framing and theorizing of space, place and tourism appearing largely based on Anglo-Saxon research contexts, not least due to the dominance and accessibility of English language literature. This is a tendency also observed across the whole spectrum of research in human geography (see for example Gutiérrez and López-Nieva, 2001).

In an attempt to redress this imbalance, twelve internationally renowned speakers from across Europe have been invited to share their knowledge and experiences of research and scholarship in their respective regional contexts, plus an overview keynote presentation which will be provided by C. Michael Hall, editor of the journal *Tourism Geographies*. We hope to map out the past and present of the tourism geographies sub-discipline within and beyond the English language contributions and learn from the historical trajectories as well as experiences of tourism geographers working in different cultural and linguistic contexts. We hope this will allow us to look to a future with increased complementarity between research in different language and more dialogue between researchers across different cultural spheres.

We invite participation from across and beyond Europe to come and debate different regional perspectives as well as to discuss future research trajectories and potential for transcending linguistic barriers in the study of tourism geographies.
