- To help participants learn how to consider children's, parents' and wider family members' points of view within families, and understand how these contribute to family dynamics in different social and cultural contexts.

- To explore issues facing service users, family members, practitioners, researchers and policymakers.

The event is aimed at practitioners working with adults, children and young people and families across health and social care and the third sector, including Safeguarding Children's leads; parents and carers with experience of using mental health services; commissioners of children and families and adult mental health services; 'Think Family' leads and team members; equality and diversity leads; transformation leads; mental health policy organisations; researchers and mental health campaigners.
