The Hydrogeology Group of the Geological Society of London is organising a one day meeting on Wednesday 9th February 2011 at Burlington House with the theme “**The Transport and Fate of Groundwater Contaminants**”. The meeting intends to examine key transport and attenuation processes and current issues relating to contaminants in groundwater and how our perceptions and understanding of the problems and their solutions have progressed.

Submission of abstracts from across the disciplines of hydrogeology (and related biological and geochemical fields) with a focus on organic contaminants (and their metabolites); inorganic contaminants (and the importance of speciation); and the use of isotopic indicators, are all encouraged. Papers which highlight recent scientific research, conceptual developments, and implications for long term monitoring and management are particularly welcome.
