Presentations on theme 2 will be given by Dr Marja Toivonen, TEKES, Finland, Professor Robert Huggins, Cardiff University and Professor Bruce Tether, Imperial College, London.

Researchers and practitioners are invited to take part in the seminar by joining in debates on issues raised by the lead speakers. There is no charge for attendance at the seminar.
