## THE VENUE

Northumbria University City Campus is in the heart of Newcastle. #### PRESENTATION FORMATS

#### **Symposium**

A symposium will be a set of 5 talks (or 4 talks plus a discussant) on a related topic. Each talk will be 15 minutes long with 5 minutes for questions. Symposia will be scheduled in parallel sessions throughout the conference. A symposium chair should submit all symposium abstracts in one package.

## **Oral presentation**

Talks will be 15 minutes long with 5 minutes for questions. Talks will be scheduled in parallel sessions throughout the conference. If you would be prepared to present your research as a poster should the programme not have space for your talk, you can select the poster presentation option as a second choice presentation format.

### **Poster presentation**

Posters will be displayed in a designated session during the conference programme. Poster presenters will be expected to attend their posters during the session.
