She worked as a research fellow in Psychology Departments in York, Durham and Reading and researched memory, aphasia and baby vision before finding the perfect job and becoming a Study Adviser at the University of Reading. In addition to working in generic learning development she is a Chartered Educational Psychologist and assesses students for dyslexia, dyspraxia, dyscalculia, ADHD and memory loss.
