RENVISIONING AFRICA WITHOUT HIV AND AIDS: The role of education

AIMS OF THE CONFERENCE

This conference aims to provide a platform for researchers, educators, activists and policy makers in the field of HIV and AIDS education - working on the continent - to make their voices heard through sharing knowledge on the role that education has played and can play in mitigating the effects of the HI virus. The conference will enable participants to share and discuss their work and ideas about HIV and AIDS education.

The theme of the conference is intended to highlight the centrality of the role of education in mitigating the impact of HIV and AIDS. With or without the cure for the virus, HIV and AIDS education remains an important means to combat the AIDS epidemic. It is thus important to take stock of the achievements and contributions that education has made in addressing HIV and AIDS, and reflect on the challenges that lie ahead as we contemplate the future of the continent. The conference provides a unique forum for this reflection. Issues for discussion and debate will include: How do we conceptualize HIV and AIDS education in Sub-Saharan Africa? How are we approaching prevention education? How are we drawing on African epistemologies to inform our interventions and research? How can education engage communities in addressing HIV and AIDS? How are we preparing the next generation for the future? How are we preparing graduates for living and working in the age of HIV and AIDS? How is our education and education linked to HIV and AIDS prevention in sub-Saharan Africa? What are the ideological and practical barriers to HIV and AIDS education in the sub-Saharan Africa region?

This conference will be multidisciplinary in context, drawing on the knowledge and expertise from across disciplines, including education, psychology, sociology, health, medicine and others.

Specific themes of the conference are:

- HIV and AIDS education in schools
- HIV and AIDS education in out of school contexts
- HIV and AIDS education in higher education
- The impact of quality education on HIV and AIDS
 mitigation

- The abstract should be as informative as possible. Please draft your abstract according to headings: Aim/Objectives, Method/Project, Key Findings, and Conclusions
- 4. Abstract length should not exceed 300 words
- 5. Abstracts should be submitted in English only
- 6. Maximum of 2 abstracts per presenting author
- 7. Indicate whether abstract is for oral or poster presentation
- 8. The abstract submitter is expected to attend the conference and present the paper or poster
- The abstract submitter should ensure all co-authors are aware of the abstract content before submission
- 10. Submission of abstract(s) constitutes consent for such to be published in conference materials
- 11. Inclusion in the Scientific Program and Abstract publication is dependent on payment of registration fees
- Abstract submission does not automatically register you for the conference. You need to register and pay the requisite conference fees as indicated
