The UALL Women in Lifelong Learning E-Mentoring Scheme (November 2010 - May 2011) was a small-scale, inter-institutional scheme aimed at women working in a variety of roles in lifelong learning. Devised as a way of capitalising on women's expertise and experience within the sector, the scheme offered an informal and cost-effective way of supporting female staff in developing career and professional strategies.

The Workshop programme will include:

- /a practical session based on the experience of a successful mentoring scheme for women in a different sector
- /the opportunity for participants to consider strategies and ideas for e-mentoring within their own organisations and contexts
