The scholarship recipient will form part of a team working on research projects on child health and human developmental pathways, such as social determinants of health, child abuse and neglect, educational outcomes, mental and physical health, juvenile delinquency. An Australian Research Council Australian Postgraduate Award (Industry) scholarship is available for a motivated PhD candidate who is interested in pursuing research in one of these areas. The successful candidate will be required to undertake a PhD under the guidance of one or more Chief Investigators on the Developmental Pathways Project. They will be able to work both independently and within a multi-disciplinary team. Work will be focussed primarily around data from the Developmental Pathways Project, which includes linked data from the WA Departments of Health, Education, Child Protection, Disabilities, Housing, Corrective Services, and Attorney General.International Students: Please note that ing allowance only.
