Opportunities to join our Committee for London

Heritage is about the past, present and future - about people, and places.

Heritage brings huge benefits to London, materially and intangibly, whether it's our national and local museums, galleries and archives, our historic public buildings, from palaces and mansions to orangeries, fountains, industrial buildings, our listed places of worship, our green spaces and designed landscapes, our diverse communities, cultural traditions and artefacts.

The Heritage Lottery Fund has, since 1994, invested more than £890 million in London's heritage involving around 3,000 projects, with awards ranging from hundreds to several million pounds. Our goal is to promote conservation and learning and enhance participation by the widest possible range of people and groups in our historic world city.

Help shape London's heritage future

We are now seeking to appoint three new Committee Members.

The Committee makes decisions on grants between £50,000 and £1 million. Recent Committee awards include support for projects to create a new gallery showcasing the work of 20th century figurative artist and teacher David Bomberg and artists of the Borough Group; restoration and access works at All Saints Church in Kingston, site of the coronation of our Saxon Kings; an oral history of Chinatown tracing the area's history through the memories of local residents and businesses; and reminiscence projects about the areas surrounding the Olympics.

The Committee also provides a crucial regional perspective and advice to the Board on larger grants, on applications within targeted programmes and on the funding priorities for London. Members represent HLF at openings and events and act as ambassadors and advocates for the value of and transformational role of heritage.

We welcome interest from people from a range of backgrounds and experiences who can demonstrate they can apply their skills, dedication and enthusiasm for role. For these appointments candidates are especially sought who have expertise and knowledge in one or more of the following; historic buildings, natural and designed landscapes, parks and gardens; engaging people from diverse communities and backgrounds; and museums, galleries and archives. Applications are welcome from individuals from black, Asian and minority ethnic communities, from individuals with disabilities and from younger people who are currently under-represented on our Committees.
